The school is a member of the Prep Schools' Rifle Association, originally established in 1906, which organises a series of competitions across the school year. Feltonfleet are regular winners, and several of the trophies available for winning the matches are truly magnificent and keenly competed for. Many ex-Feltonfleet pupils who have continued to shoot in their senior schools, have subsequently earned International Honours.

The facilities and what we offer.

The school is very lucky in having both Air Rifle and .22" Small Bore ranges. Jeanette Lievers is fantastic at introducing youngsters to Air Rifle in year 5, often they are showing huge promise even at that stage. We welcome pupils from year 6 into the .22" range.

The training process.

Safety is an absolute priority! The children are given a comprehensive safety brief on first attendance and are reminded at every visit. Training begins with resting the rifles on bags, emphasising all the techniques needed to excel. Though physical strength can help, it is by no means essential. Far more important is control of the whole body. Even the feet! It is a sport where physical prowess and exemplary ball sense are not required. There is also no gender differentiation.
