Art Club (Years 1 - 2) - Miss Collins

This relaxed and sociable club gives pupils the chance to explore a wide variety of board games and puzzles, from old favourites to exciting new challenges. As they play, pupils develop important skills such as turn-taking, strategic thinking, teamwork, and perseverance. It's a great way to wind down after a busy day while still keeping minds active and engaged.

Card Games & Puzzles (Years 7 - 8) - Mrs Shervell

Card Games & Puzzles Club is a chance for Upper School pupils to rediscover the traditional joy of playing cards and solving puzzles. Each week, we'll learn either a classic card game (from Rummy and Newmarket to Sevens, Solitaire and Whist) or sharpen our minds with a new puzzle (e.g. Sudoku, Kakuro, Kenken and Hidato). Whether you're a complete beginner, or already familiar with many of these games and puzzles, this is the perfect way to unwind at the end of a long day, while practising strategy and (often) probability—without even realizing it! Climbing (Years 7 - 8) - Mr Pomeroy

Climbing Club offers Years 7 and 8 pupils the chance to develop strength, agility, problem-solving skills and resilience in a fun and supportive environment. Using the climbing wall in our Sports Hall, pupils learn a range of techniques to improve their climbing ability, build confidence, and challenge themselves physically and mentally. Whether they are beginners or have some experience, all are welcome to take part and enjoy the sense of achievement that comes from reaching new heights.

Codebreaking (Years 3 - 4) - Mrs Rosewarne

In Code Breaking Club, pupils step into the shoes of secret agents as they crack codes, solve puzzles, and unravel mysteries. Each week, they explore different types of codes and ciphers—such as Morse code, Caesar shifts, and symbol substitutions—while using logic, pattern spotting, and teamwork to crack the clues. The club builds problem-solving skills, perseverance, and attention to detail, all wrapped up in exciting challenges that make thinking feel like an adventure.

Debating (Years 5 - 6 & Years 7 - 8) - Ms Watts, Mrs Lance

Debating Club provides a structured, supportive space for pupils to develop their public speaking, critical thinking, and persuasive communication skills. Through weekly sessions, pupils explore a range of current and age-appropriate topics, learning to form

arguments, consider opposing viewpoints, and speak with confidence in front of their peers. Pupils are encouraged to research both sides of an argument and may be asked to debate positions they don't personally agree with, to help build empathy and a deeper understanding of complex issues.

DT (Years 3 - 4) - Mrs Day & Mrs Butcher

DT Club is a fun, hands-on opportunity for children to explore a wide range of materials and creative processes. DT Club encourages pupils to investigate how different materials behave and to experiment with techniques such as cutting, joining, shaping, and decorating. Pupils are supported to develop and test their own design ideas, building confidence as young designers and problem-solvers while bringing their imaginative creations to life.

Football (Years 5 - 8) - Mr Kumar

Football club is a fun 'game-based' club, where footballers of all abilities will hone their skills and play some competitive and structured mini matches.

Girls' Football (Years 5 - 6) - Ms Chubb

The Girls' football club is a fantastic way to combine fun and fitness! It's a chance for girls of all skill levels to enjoy the beautiful game, in a supportive environment. They will learn new skills or perfect existing ones through exciting activities.

History (Years 6 - 8) - Mrs Williamson

History Club offers an exciting and hands-on journey through the past, where pupils bring history to life through creativity, role play and investigation. From escaping a Gunpowder Plot-themed escape room to uncovering what really happened to the Titanic, pupils are challenged to think critically and imaginatively and, most importantly, like historians. They've re-enacted the Salem Witch Trials, negotiated peace during the Cuban Missile Crisis, debated who should be king in 1066, and taken part in trading games inspired by the Spanish Armada and the Aztecs. Pupils have also designed Tudor board games based on the Field of the Cloth of Gold, and explored events like D-Day and the Suffragette movement. History Club encourages curiosity, collaboration and a genuine love of history beyond the classroom.

Hockey (Years 5 - 8) - Mr Williams & Miss Smithyman

Hockey Club is an open, inclusive club for all pupils in Years 5 to 8 who want to develop their skills, enjoy playing, and be part of a friendly team environment. The club welcomes everyone to join in the fun whatever their skill level.

Sessions focus on building fundamental skills such as dribbling, passing, shooting, and positioning, alongside game awareness and teamwork. Emphasis is placed on fair play, enjoyment, and developing confidence on the pitch. This club provides a great opportunity for pupils to stay active, enhance their skills and foster a love of hockey!

Lego (Years 3 - 4) - Mrs Morrison

Lego Club is a hands-on, imaginative space where children design, build, and create using a wide range of Lego bricks. Each session encourages pupils to think creatively and solve problems, whether they're following a brief—like building a bridge, a vehicle, or a scene from a story—or working on their own original ideas. Along the way, they develop fine motor skills, spatial awareness, and collaborative skills as they share ideas, explain their thinking, and sometimes team up on group builds. It's a joyful mix of play, creativity, and quiet focus that pupils look forward to each week.

Netball (Years 3 - 4 & Years 5 – 6) - Miss Wright, Mr Baldwin

A chance to learn and perfect netball skills and drills. We will cover all aspects of the game including, passing, shooting, set pieces plays and rules of the game.

Podcasting (Years 7 - 8) - Mrs Sieczko

Podcasting is a fun and creative club where pupils will learn how to make their own podcasts. Working together or individually, they will plan, write, and record episodes on topics they care about—like school events, favourite books, or interviews with teachers and friends. They'll get hands-on experience using microphones, editing software, and storytelling skills. It's a great way to build confidence, share ideas, and have their voices heard

Science (Years 5 - 6) - Mr Palmer-Leeraar

Science club is a brilliant way to explore the wonders of the world through exciting hands-on experiments like foamy "elephant's toothpaste" in chemistry, building and launching rockets for physics, unraveling colors with chromatography, or even making giant, shimmering bubbles. It's a chance for students to get hands-on, stay curious, and work together while learning new things.

Sketch (Years 3 - 4) - Mrs Ralston

Sketch Club is a calm and creative space where pupils follow step-by-step video tutorials to produce their own drawings. Each session focuses on a different subject—such as animals, landscapes, or cartoon characters—and helps children build confidence in their sketching skills. As they copy the examples on screen, they develop hand-eye coordination, attention to detail, and a sense of pride in their finished work. It's a relaxing way to wind down at the end of their day!

Swimming (Years 3 - 4) - Miss Rita

Our non-competitive swim club is perfect for pupils who want to stay active, build water confidence, enjoy the water, and improve their swimming skills- all in a fun, friendly, and supportive environment. We focus on stroke technique, relays, water safety, and overall swimming ability at a pace that fits each swimmer. In addition we also introduce basic water polo in a fun and beginner friendly way.

Touch Typing (Years 5 - 6) - Mrs Houston

Touch Typing Club is a great opportunity for children to build a lifelong skill that will support them throughout their education. As they prepare for secondary school, being able to type quickly and accurately will help them complete longer pieces of writing with confidence and ease. It can also improve spelling, written fluency, and overall independence with digital tasks. The club provides a fun and structured way to learn this important skill in a relaxed, supportive environment.

Warhammer (Years 5 - 8) - Mr Pearce

Model building, painting and maths combine in this hands-on wargaming club. Most materials will be provided but, if the children would like to bring in their own models and paint, they are welcome to.

Clubs with an Additional Cost

Air Rifle Shooting (Years 3 - 8) - Jeanette Leivers

Cost: £16 for lunch times; £17 for after school sessions.

Shooting is one of Feltonfleet's most successful and distinguished sports. The school has built a strong reputation nationally, having produced some of the country's top junior marksmen and securing many major national trophies. We are proud to have both

a .22 small-bore and air rifle range on-site, offering pupils outstanding facilities in a safe and structured environment.

Air Rifle Shooting is available to pupils from Year 3 upwards and is one of the most inclusive sports we offer. It is equally popular with girls and boys, as it does not rely on speed or strength, making it accessible to all. Instead, it promotes valuable skills such as focus, concentration, and hand-eye coordination. Sessions take place at lunchtimes on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, with additional opportunities after school on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Art (Years 3 - 4 & Years 5 - 6) - Jo Thompson

Cost: £10 per session

Art Club is a creative and enjoyable after-school activity that encourages pupils to express themselves freely through a wide range of techniques and materials, without the limitations of a set curriculum.

Each session is shaped by discussion, exploring different artistic styles and subjects. Pupils have the opportunity to experiment with watercolours, acrylics, printmaking, charcoal, pastels, pens, collage, and more.

Children may choose to collaborate with others or work independently on their own projects. While some pieces develop over multiple weeks, many are completed within a single session.

The club provides a relaxed and supportive environment where pupils can enjoy time with friends, explore their creativity, and receive guidance from an experienced tutor.

Athletics (Years 3 - 6) - Phil Amos

Cost: £10 per session

Athletics Club offers a fun, inclusive, and rewarding environment for all pupils from Year 3 to Year 8. Under the expert guidance of Phil Amos, a UK Athletics Level 3 Qualified Coach, pupils have the opportunity to run, jump, and throw while developing key skills, improving technique, and tracking their progress. Sessions focus on enjoyment and personal growth, helping each child to build confidence, fitness, and a lifelong love of sport.

Book Club (Years 4 - 5) - Andy Rumbold

Cost: £133.99 per term

Tween the Lines after-school club is designed to inspire a lifelong love of reading. The novels we use are age appropriate and chosen for their gripping storylines and quality of writing. With an emphasis on reading for pleasure, we'll explore a novel over the course of a term. Vocabulary games with words from the book, role play, hot seating and

discussion are just some of the fun and stimulating ways in which the story will be brought to life. While reading the books we'll explore inferred meaning in the text by unpacking language, as well as looking character development, choice of language, the way the writer creates tension and atmosphere. Hopefully this, along with the vocabulary development, will ultimately stand your child in good stead for their future English exams and, just as importantly, develop a lifelong love of reading.

Chess (Years 3 - 8) - Marcus Gosling

Cost: £10 per session (plus £5 for Chess puzzle book)

Chess develops a child's problem-solving skills and understanding of action and response. The game requires not only great creativity but also planning, precision, concentration, logic and thoughtful decision-making. It is also an enjoyable social activity, proven to aid a child's development and quicken academic progress. The club is run by Marcus Gosling, president of Epsom Chess Club, a young and dynamic teacher. From term to term, pupils learn in varied ways with the help of bespoke puzzle books created by Marcus and are able to compete against one another for prizes, glory and qualification into the UK Chess Challenge Megafinal. Pupils learn key tactics and strategies while developing their concentration and problem-solving skills in a fun and supportive environment. No prior knowledge or experience of playing chess is required!

Cookery (Years 5 - 6 & Years 7 - 8) - Emma Wells (Cook Stars)

Cost: £15 per session

Cook Stars cookery sessions are filled with good food, plenty of hands-on experience and are great fun! The classes are designed with little chefs in mind and each week pupils will learn to cook something different that they will love to eat, for example pizza, muffins, pastries.

Each child has their own workstation and creates their own delicious dish from scratch. They take their dish home along with a recipe card to keep. Pupils take part in a fun craft activity whilst the dishes are cooking and enjoy a snack. The classes provide everything your child will need – aprons, ingredients, equipment and packaging to take their dish home.

Cricket (Years 3 - 4, Years 5 - 6 & Years 7 - 8) - Power Play

Cost: £10 per session

Cricket Club offers high-quality coaching delivered by ECB-qualified coaches, provided through the well-regarded Power Play Cricket coaching company. These experienced coaches bring energy, expertise, and a passion for the game, creating a fun, inclusive, and supportive environment for pupils of all abilities.

Sessions take place in the Sports Hall and are carefully structured to develop core cricketing skills including batting, bowling, fielding, and match awareness. Pupils are encouraged to build confidence, improve technique, and understand the spirit and strategy of the game. Whether your child is new to cricket or looking to refine their skills, the emphasis is on enjoyment, teamwork, and individual progress.

This exciting LAMDA Club focuses on the Devising Drama syllabus, offering pupils the opportunity to work collaboratively to write, direct, and perform their own original pieces. It is ideal for children who enjoy creative storytelling, ensemble work, and bringing their own ideas to life on stage.

Working in groups, pupils will learn how to build scenes from scratch, develop characters, structure narratives, and rehearse as a team. Alongside the creative process, the club supports the development of important life skills such as teamwork, communication, confidence, and creative thinking.

The club is open to pupils in Years 3–5 and Years 6–8, with content and groupings tailored appropriately for each age range.

Graded LAMDA exams in Devising Drama are available but entirely optional, and will be discussed based on each child's progress and confidence.

This is a fantastic opportunity for pupils to develop their voice as young theatre-makers in a supportive and imaginative environment.

Disney Club (Years 1–2) – Jasmine Taylor

Cost: £10 per session

Disney Club is a fun, singing-focused club for pupils in Years 1 and 2 who love to sing along to their favourite Disney songs. Each week, children will learn and rehearse well-known Disney tunes while developing vocal confidence, musicality, and expression.

While the main focus is on singing, we'll also explore how to bring songs to life with simple movement and acting—encouraging children to use their imagination and express character through voice and performance.

No experience needed—just a love of singing and a sprinkle of Disney magic!

Fencing (Years 3 - 8) - Marc Bengry

Cost: £10 per session

Fencing is coached by Marc Bengry (Four times Commonwealth medallist and former British Champion). Marc has been coaching for over 20 years and has produced 16 British and English Champions and 117 National Championship medallists.

Fencing is an exciting individual and team Olympic sport and is suitable for both boys and girls. It is a fast, dynamic non-contact martial arts style sport that combines fitness and athleticism with technical skill and precision timing.

Fencing benefits children by developing skills they need in everyday life such as improved concentration, discipline, control, fitness, application of tactical ideas and working with others as part of a team. They will also learn leadership skills when they take turns to referee practice fights.

Fencing is run at school on Tuesdays 4:30pm – 5:30pm for pupils in Years 3 - 8. Pupils are also welcome to join Cobham Fencing Club which is run by Marc on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings either at Notre Dame School or at Feltonfleet through term time.

Clothing requirements: Long stretchy trousers/tracksuit (not shorts), t-shirt and trainers. All fencing equipment and safety clothing will be provided by the coach.

Football (Years 3 - 4) - Josh Evans

Cost: £9.62 per session

The Josh Evans Football Club offers a fun, energetic and inclusive environment where pupils build their skills through fun drills, technique-focused activities, and small-sided games. Each session helps develop key areas such as passing, dribbling, shooting, and defending, with an emphasis on teamwork, agility, and learning how to play as part of a team. Pupils gain an understanding of match awareness—like positioning and decision-making—while enjoying plenty of opportunities to practise and play. Whether your child

is new to the game or already a keen footballer, the club supports their development in a fun and encouraging way.

Girls' Rugby & Boys' Rugby (Years 7 - 8) - Miss Crompton

Cost: £10 per session

The Girls' and Boys' rugby clubs are exciting after school clubs which provide pupils with the opportunity to either try a new sport or hone their existing skills! For the girls, each week, we will focus on basic skills such as passing, tackling and kicking alongside lots of touch games. This club will be an inclusive space where the girls can let go and be themselves whilst also being challenged in a different context.

The boys will be able to develop their skills and passion for the game in a fun, focused environment. The club provides high-quality coaching in core rugby skills, gameplay tactics, and team development. Whether aiming to improve performance or simply enjoy the sport, boys of all ability levels are welcome to take part and learn from an inspiring role model.

Introductory LAMDA Club (Years 1–2) – Jasmine Taylor

Cost: £10 per session

This club offers a gentle and engaging introduction to LAMDA for pupils in Years 1 and 2, following the Introductory Stages 1–3 syllabus. Through the exploration of verse and prose, children begin to develop key communication and performance skills in a supportive and creative environment.

The sessions are designed to build confidence, improve clarity of speech, and encourage expressive use of voice and body. Pupils also benefit from developing focus, listening skills, and the ability to speak clearly in front of others—skills that support them far beyond the drama room.

Graded examinations for the Introductory Stages are entirely optional and can be discussed on an individual basis depending on the child's readiness and interest.

This is an ideal starting point for young learners to grow in confidence while discovering the joy of speaking and performing.

LAMDA Individual lessons (Years 3 - 8) - Jasmine Taylor

Cost: £30 per session

LAMDA lessons provide pupils with expert coaching in communication, performance, and confidence-building, following the prestigious London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art (LAMDA) syllabus. Delivered by experienced professional performers and LAMDA practitioners from Behind the Scenes Academy, these sessions focus on developing speaking and acting skills across a variety of disciplines such as public speaking, poetry recital, drama, and performance technique.

Pupils learn to interpret texts, express ideas clearly, and engage an audience with creativity and confidence. LAMDA lessons not only support artistic growth but also nurture vital life skills including self-expression, presentation, and effective communication, which benefit pupils in all areas of learning and beyond.

Pupils may also choose to take graded LAMDA exams, gaining recognised qualifications and valuable experience in both performance and public speaking.

Musical Theatre (Years 3 - 8) - Jasmine Taylor

Cost: £12 per session

Step into the spotlight with our dynamic and fun-filled Musical Theatre group! Designed for young performers who love to sing, dance, and act, our sessions build confidence, creativity, and stage skills in a supportive and energetic environment.

Each week, students work on vocal technique, choreography, and character development, all while rehearsing well-loved songs and musicals. Whether you're dreaming of the West End or just love to perform, our group welcomes all experience levels.

Songwriting Club (Years 5 - 6 & Years 7 - 8) - Jasmine Taylor

Cost: £12 per session

Songwriting Club is a creative and inspiring space where pupils learn to write and develop their own original songs. From exploring lyrics and melody to experimenting with rhythm and structure, children are encouraged to find their unique voice and express themselves through music.

Each session focuses on building musical confidence while developing key creative skills such as storytelling, lyric writing, and collaboration. Pupils will have the chance to share ideas, receive feedback, and perform their work in a supportive environment.

No previous songwriting experience is needed—just a love of music and a willingness to try something new. Whether your child is a budding singer, poet, or musician, this club provides a fun and imaginative outlet for self-expression.

Strength & Conditioning (Years 6 - 8) - Mike Stern

Cost: £10 per session

Our Strength and Conditioning club with Mike Stern introduces young athletes to structured, age-appropriate training that focuses on building the key foundations needed for long-term athletic development. Through engaging and progressive sessions, participants improve their strength, speed, coordination, and overall body awareness, while learning essential movement patterns and fitness principles that support their everyday sports performance.

Beyond physical development, the club is designed to build confidence, promote a positive mindset toward training, and help children develop lifelong healthy habits.

Taekwondo (Years 3 - 8) - Jack Britton (London TKD)

Cost: £10.50 per session

The London TKD School Club is an exciting children's martial arts programme at the cutting edge of character building and life skills development. Throughout the term, pupils will learn a variety of self-defence techniques, specifically designed for realistic situations that children find themselves in. These classes also help develop a positive attitude through learning, meditation, mindfulness and confidence building exercises. No prior experience of martial arts is necessary; the club caters for all abilities.

Tennis (Years 3 - 8) - Karen Hunter

Cost: £165 per term

The Tennis Coaching club offers fun, high-energy sessions for all skill levels. Led by professional and very experienced coaches, the focus is on developing technique, tactical awareness, and partnership skills through engaging drills and exciting games. Players will improve their confidence on court while learning how to work as a team and think strategically—all in a supportive and friendly environment!

.22 Target Shooting (Years 6 - 8) - Andrew Lothian

Cost: £25 per session

Shooting is one of Feltonfleet's most successful and distinguished sports. The school has built a strong reputation nationally, having produced some of the country's top junior marksmen and securing many major national trophies. We are proud to have both a .22 small-bore and air rifle range on-site, offering pupils outstanding facilities in a safe and structured environment.

Coaching is led by Andrew Lothian, an experienced and passionate instructor, who visits the school weekly to develop and inspire our young shooters. Target shooting is open to pupils from Year 6 upwards, with .22 shooting sessions taking place during the school day on Monday and Tuesday mornings. Pupils are grouped according to their experience, allowing them to progress at an appropriate pace.

Shooting sessions are carefully timetabled to minimise disruption to academic lessons. Pupils may shoot during selected lessons or break times, but core subjects such as English, Maths and Science are avoided, and children are rotated weekly to ensure a balanced schedule. Competitive opportunities are offered each term, including fixtures and participation in the Nationwide Prep Schools League.

Invitation Only Clubs

Art Masters (Years 6 - 8) - Mrs Fellingham

(Year 6 invited in the Spring Term)

These sessions are designed specifically for our Art Scholars in Years 7 and 8, offering a focused and enriching environment to extend their creative thinking and technical skills.

Tuesdays: Whole-group exploration of an overarching theme, focusing on advanced techniques, approaches, and portfolio development.

Thursdays: Individual project work, classwork extension, one-to-one tutorials, further portfolio development, and 13+ scholarship assessment preparation.

Pupils are welcome to attend one or both sessions. For those aiming for a 13+ external art scholarship, attending both sessions from Year 7 onwards is highly recommended to support the necessary portfolio development and skills acquisition.

Pupils in Year 6 will be invited in the Spring Term.

Choirs (Years 3 - 8) - Mr Andrews & Miss Weinel

There is a choir at Feltonfleet for everyone! With no audition process, we just ask that children commit to a whole term and come to the weekly rehearsals so they can learn music to sing at performances.

Cricket Squad (Years 6 - 8) - Mr Rishton

Pupils in Years 6 to 8 invited to these sessions are those identified as having the potential to elevate our performances in national competitions. The squad is dynamic and may change throughout the year, with Year 5 pupils potentially joining after the first term in the Spring. Sessions focus on building and refining existing skills while working collaboratively as a squad across year groups. This vertical approach maximises each pupil's development, helping to enhance their abilities and improve overall performance.

Drama Masters (Years 6-7) - Mr Fellingham

This weekly session is for our internal scholars (and also those pupils considering applying for internal scholarship) for drama/performing arts. Pupils will complete a range of activities to foster growing acting, devising, collaboration and general performance knowledge and skills. These skills will also support future applications for 13+ scholarships at senior schools.

Drama Scholars (Year 8) - Mr Fellingham

Drama Scholarship Preparation Club offers focused support for Year 8 pupils preparing to apply for Drama scholarships to senior schools. The club guides pupils through every

stage of the process, including understanding application requirements, preparing and performing monologues, responding to direction, and participating confidently in group workshops. Sessions also explore what senior schools are looking for in successful candidates, helping pupils to present themselves with creativity, clarity, and confidence. Emphasis is placed on performance technique, vocal and physical expression, and interview preparation.

DT (Years 5 - 8) - Mrs Day & Mrs Woodward

DT Club is an opportunity for pupils who are keen to develop their design and technology skills. Through creative, project-based work, pupils have the opportunity to explore a broad range of materials and techniques, including wood, plastics, fabrics, resin, electronics, and 3D printing using CAD software. They are encouraged to experiment with advanced processes such as precision cutting, complex joining, shaping, and finishing. With plenty of scope for independent thinking and innovation, pupils develop and test their own design ideas, gaining confidence as designers and problem-solvers. Pupils pursuing senior school scholarships in design and engineering will be supported through this club.

There is a charge of £25+ VAT per term for materials.

Hockey Squad (Years 7 - 8) - Mr Williams & Mr Malloy

Upper School Hockey squad is aimed at pupils who demonstrate strong ability, commitment, and potential in hockey. Selected by the Games staff, this club offers a higher level of training to extend skills and develop tactical understanding in preparation for competitive matches and tournaments. Sessions focus on advanced stick work, positional play, game strategies, and team cohesion, with an emphasis on high performance, discipline, and sportsmanship. This club provides a valuable opportunity for players to push their development and refine their skills.

Instrumental Groups (Years 3 - 8) - Mr Andrews & Miss Weinel

We have lots of fabulous music ensembles for the children to join. We have two excellent orchestras, a jazz band, guitar ensemble, string ensemble, wind ensemble and two recorder groups. So performers thrive, we check children are of a suitable level for each group - if in doubt, get in touch.

Netball Squad (Years 7 - 8) - Miss Whitton

The Upper School Netball Squad is designed for pupils who show strong potential and enthusiasm for netball. Selected by the Games staff, this squad provides an opportunity for more advanced coaching and competitive development beyond the regular curriculum. Sessions focus on refining technical skills, tactical understanding, and positional play, as well as building fitness, teamwork, and match awareness. The squad will also prepare for fixtures and tournaments, representing the school in higher-level

competition. This is an exciting and challenging opportunity for girls who are ready to take their netball to the next level.

Sport Scholars (Years 7 - 8) - Mr Rishton

This weekly session is specifically designed to enhance our Year 7 and 8 scholars' physical skills, fundamental fitness, and understanding of the expectations during senior school scholarship assessment days. We analyse performance data in detail, helping pupils interpret their results and use this information to tailor personalised training plans that target their individual strengths and areas for improvement. Equally important, we explore the theory behind athletic performance, introducing key concepts and approaches that support physical development and mental preparation. All elements are carefully adapted to meet the unique needs of each pupil, ensuring they are well-prepared, confident, and equipped to perform at their best.

Swim Squads (Year 3, Year 4, Years 5 - 6 & Years 7 - 8) - Miss Rita

In Years 3 and 4 we aim to educate the children in Lower Swim Squad by starting to learn the techniques for competitive swimming i.e. racing protocol, starts and finishes, relay swimming and stroke technique, plus some speed and stamina work.

In Years 5 and 6, we aim to develop the speed and skills needed for competitive swimming i.e. starts and finishes, relay swimming and stroke technique, plus some speed and stamina work. Year 5 swimmers are introduced to the National IAPS championships competition and Year 6 swimmers are able to compete in the English Schools National Team Competition

In years 7 and 8 swimmers are expected to demonstrate self-discipline and commitment to swim squad training in line with being role models for the younger swimmers. Our senior swimmers competing in inter-school galas, English Schools National Competition and the National IAPS Swimming Championships are expected to represent the school both in performance in the water and leadership to the swimming team as a whole.
